CHAPTER 6
STREETS

ARTICLE 1
ROAD WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS

SECTION 6-100. No person shall operate any vehicle or combination of vehicles weighing over five (5) tons per axle on any road in the City of Columbus, Anoka County, Minnesota, where such restriction is posted.

SECTION 6-101. Said weight restriction shall be posted during the same period of time as Anoka County posts its weight restriction notices.

SECTION 6-102. Any person found guilty of operating a vehicle or combination of vehicles in excess of the maximum weight limitations shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine or imprisonment in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 1, Section 1-109 of this City Code.

ARTICLE II
PARKING

SECTION 6-200. No person shall permit a vehicle under his or her ownership, operation, or control to be left parked and unattended on any public roadway in the City of Columbus for a period of more than four (4) hours, except under the following conditions:

A. The City Council may by resolution designate that parking is not permitted along certain public roadways during specific time periods or public events.

B. In approving the resolution allowing parking along designated public roadways, the City Council will determine that it is in the public's interest and safety to deny parking along such roadways.

SECTION 6-201. When requested by the maintenance department or any law enforcement officer, any owner, operator or person in control of the vehicle shall move the vehicle so as to permit the maintenance of snow removal within a reasonable period of time.

SECTION 6-202. If a condition exists at 4:00 o'clock in the morning on any day which shall require the plowing or removal of snow from the City roads and streets, then, in that case, no person shall permit a vehicle under his ownership, operation or control to be left unattended on any City road or street in the City of Columbus, for a period from 4:00 o'clock a.m. to 4:00 o'clock p.m.

SECTION 6-203. When a law enforcement officer shall find a vehicle parked or left unattended upon any street or alley in violation of the above provision of the ordinance, he may provide for the removal of such vehicle to a convenient place of storage. The owner may redeem the same from such place of storage upon proof of ownership and paying the cost of removal and any storage charged thereof.

SECTION 6-204. Any person violating the provision of this Chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine or imprisonment in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 1, Section 1-109 of this City Code.
