FRIDAY UPDATE: 04.26.19

This past few weeks we have received MULTIPLE complaints about ATV's, dirt bikes, recreational fires, loose dogs, and many other ordinance issues. It is obvious the weather is getting nice and people are out-and-about. We are asking everyone to PLEASE learn your city's ordinances – and follow them. Ordinance information can be found on your city's website. This is also where you should check for any burning restrictions that may be issued in your city.

Andover

Burglaries

- 04.22 133xx Uplander St NW – owner heard house alarm door sensor; vehicle in garage rummaged
- 04.22 133xx Uplander St NW – theft from vehicle in garage, unsecured; center console contents

04.25 35/Lake Dr NE – 2nd degree DWI, Driving after Revocation, Obstructing the Legal Process, Failure to Drive in a Single Lane, Open Bottle Possession, Possession of over 1.4 grams of Marijuana in a Vehicle; a deputy stopped a vehicle for driving over the median of a round-about. The driver wasn't listening to the verbal commands to turn off the vehicle. The deputy approached the vehicle and the driver appeared intoxicated; the driver continued to be belligerent and refused tests. He was arrested. Due to two prior DWI's the charges were elevated.

She gave her sister's name not realizing her sister had a warrant too. The driver was issued a citation and the passenger was arrested.
- 04.21 2400 Block 229 Ave NE – DWI, Refusal; deputies responded to a vehicle rollover. The driver appeared intoxicated and stated he had a couple bottles of wine. He failed the field sobriety tests and refused the PBT. He was arrested.
- 04.21 Viking Blvd/Isetta St NE – Controlled Substance Possession; a deputy stopped a vehicle because the driver was a juvenile with a warrant. The driver was arrested for the warrant. Drugs were located on the passenger and he was arrested too.
- 04.22 5xx Lincoln Dr NE – Felony Stalking; Anoka PD requested we go to the location and arrest a male for stalking. Deputies went to the location, found the male, and arrested him.

In plain sight was marijuana and there was a white powdery substance all over the front on the driver's shirt. The driver stated he thought they were parked on the shoulder of the roadway. Both occupants were arrested.
