

In accord with the December 10, 2020 letter from City Administrator Elizabeth Mursko to Mr. Todd Mercil at 5137 190th Ln NE, which stipulated requirements to address drainage deficiencies related to his 2017 building permit for a garage addition, Mr. Mercil has submitted the attached drainage plan via email dated January 28, 2021.

Based on the review of the plan by Water Resource Engineer Tim Olson and me, we find that the plan satisfactorily addresses the drainage deficiencies associated with the 2017 building permit and recommend that Mr. Mercil move forward with the improvement. The improvement consists primarily of installing the existing flexible drainage pipe on the north side of the garage below ground and connecting to his existing tile system which runs along the west side of the house.

We further recommend that Mr. Mercil perform annual maintenance on his entire drainage system and on the swales on the north side of the house and the south side of the garage so that drainage makes it all the way to the lake and to the existing catch basin without spilling on to neighboring property.

Upon completion of the work, Mr. Mercil should notify me so that a final inspection can be performed to determine compliance with the submitted plan and final close-out of the issues associated with the building permit.

This corrective order is authorized pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 326B.121, Subd. 2. Please note that a violation of the City Code is a misdemeanor and may be prosecuted in accordance with state law and in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 1, Article I, Section 109 of the City Code.

Dear Mayor and Council:

The work performed by Metro Utilities, Inc. for the NE Quad I-35/TH 97 Utility Extensions is complete and ready for final acceptance. We have agreed on the final quantities of work and the adjustments to the final cost. The as-constructed final quantities amount is \$230,106.40 compared to the revised contract amount of \$235,268.68. (The original contract amount was \$246,774.00, however the contractor agreed to forfeit the project retainage of \$11,505.32 in lieu of correcting Punch List Item No. 8, which is a small sag in the first 8' length of sanitary sewer pipe extending northerly out of Manhole No. 300-1. The City will apply these funds towards correcting this item in the future should it ever become an issue.)

The contractor has also furnished the following required documentation to receive final payment:

- Consent of Surety to Final Payment
- Department of Taxation IC-134 forms
- Lien Waivers from subcontractors and suppliers

Actions Requested

- 1. Approve Change Order No. 1 to Metro Utilities, Inc. in the amount of (-\$11,505.32).
- 2. Approve Final Payment Estimate No. 3F to Metro Utilities, Inc. in the amount of \$2,162.20.

ORDINANCE NO. 21-

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 13: BUILDING CODE OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS CODE OF ORDINANCES

The City Council of the City of Columbus ordains:

SECTION I. Chapter 13 is hereby amended as follows:

ARTICLE I

ADOPTION

SECTION 13-100. CODES ADOPTED BY REFERENCE. The Minnesota State Building Code, as adopted by the Commissioner of Labor and Industry pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapter 326B, as amended, including all of the amendments, rules and regulations established, adopted and published from time to time by the Minnesota Commissioner of Labor and Industry, through the Building Codes and Standards Division is hereby adopted by reference with the exception of the optional chapters, unless specifically adopted in this Ordinance. The Minnesota State Building Code is hereby incorporated in this Ordinance as if fully set out herein.

SECTION 13-101. DELETED

SECTION 13-102. EXISTING BUILDINGS. Buildings in existence at the time of the adoption of this Code may have their existing use or occupancy continued, if such use or occupancy was legal at the time of adoption of this Code, provided:

- (1) such continued use is not dangerous to life; or,
- (2) such continued use is not found unsafe or substandard as defined by the Housing Code (Chapter 16A of the Columbus City Code); or,
- (3) such continued us is not found to be hazardous or dangerous as defined by the Dangerous Buildings Code (Chapter 16B of the Columbus City Code); or,
- (4) such continued use is not found to be in a violation of the Minnesota Uniform Fire Code (Chapter 11 of the Columbus City Code); or,
- (5) such continued use is not found to be a violation of the Life Safety Code (Chapter 12 of the Columbus City Code); or,
- (6) such continued use is not found to be a violation of the Public Health Ordinance (Chapter 14 of the Columbus City Code).

SECTION 13-103. STORM WATER MANAGEMENT PLAN AS A PREREQUISITE. No building permit shall be issued until the Zoning Administrator has determined that the proposed development is exempt from the provisions of Chapter 7D or that a proper Storm Water Management Plan has been submitted to the City.

SECTION 13-104. BUILDING CODE AND OPTIONAL CHAPTERS. The Minnesota State Building Code, established pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapter

326B, as amended, allows the City of Columbus to adopt by reference and enforce certain optional chapters of the most current addition of the Minnesota State Building Code.

The following optional provisions identified in the most current addition of the State Building Code are hereby adopted and incorporated as part of the building code for the City of Columbus:

1. Chapter 1305 Appendix Chapter J.

ARTICLE II PERMITS, FEES, INSPECTIONS

SECTION 13-200. PERMITS REQUIRED. The issuance of permits shall be as required in MN Rule Part 1300.0120 of the Minnesota State Building Code.

SECTION 13-201. FEES.

- A. The building permit fees are as listed in the adopted City of Columbus fee schedule.
- B. All fees for permits issued by the Building Official shall be computed on the basis of the fees contained in the adopted City of Columbus fee schedule with the following modifications:

Private Sewer System Construction: See City Code Section 14-646 for the fee amount.

Pumping Permit (Scavenging) for Private Sewer System: See City Code Section 14-646 for the fee amount.

SECTION 13-202. PLAN-CHECKING FEE. Plan Checking fees shall be calculated and paid in accordance with the currently adopted City of Columbus fee schedule.

SECTION 13-203. INSPECTIONS. The Building Official is hereby granted the authority to enter upon any premises between sunrise and sunset to determine compliance with this Code. The Building Official shall make such inspection as is necessary to determine compliance with this Code. No part of any construction shall be covered or concealed until it has been inspected and accepted by the Building Official. It shall be the responsibility of the permittee to notify the Building Official that the job is ready for inspection or re-inspection. It shall be the duty of the owner or occupant of the property to give the Building Official free access to the property at reasonable times for the purpose of making such inspections. Upon satisfactory completion and final inspection of the system, the Building Official shall indicate approval of the work.

SECTION 13-204. RE-INSPECTION. If upon inspection, the Building Official discovers that any construction or installation is not constructed in accordance with the minimum standards provided in this Code, he/she shall give the permittee written notification describing the defects. The permittee shall pay an additional fee in accordance with the currently adopted City of Columbus fee schedule for each reinspection that is necessary. The permittee shall be responsible for the correction or elimination of all defects and no system shall be placed or replaced in service until all defects have been corrected or eliminated.

SECTION 13-205. DELETED

ARTICLE III VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES

SECTION 13-300. VIOLATIONS. Pursuant to Minnesota Rules Part 1300.0150 and Minnesota Statutes Section 326B.082, a violation of the code is a misdemeanor, and may be prosecuted in accordance with state law and in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 1, Article I, Section 109 of the City Code.

SECTION 13-310. PENALTIES.

- A. The payment of any investigation fee shall not exempt any person from payment of the regular permit fee required by this Code.
- B. No investigation fee shall be charged for an investigation of construction which the Building Official determines to be construction which does not require a permit pursuant to this Code.

ARTICLE IV LICENSES, FEES AND REQUIREMENTS

SECTION 13-400. COMMERCIAL CONTRACTOR'S LICENSE. The City of Columbus requires that all commercial contractors be licensed within the City. The City may issue licenses to commercial contractors upon application to the City and approval of the Building Official.

SECTION 13-401. FEES AND REQUIREMENTS. The application for a commercial contractor's license requires a fee payable to the City (see Columbus Fee Schedule in Uncodified Ordinance Section). In order to be approved by the City, commercial contractors must meet the following requirements:

- 1. Insurance commercial contactors must carry a minimum of \$1,000,000.00 in liability insurance; and
- 2. Grading Bond commercial contactors must obtain a bond for any grading to be done on a particular project in the amount of \$1,000.00 per acre of excavation.

The City Council of the City of Columbus adopted Ordinance No. 21, An Ordinance Amending Chapter 13 regarding the City Building Code, on April 14, 2021 and approved this summary of the ordinance for publication on, 2021.
The City Council has authority to regulate the City's municipal Code. Following discussion at the April 14, 2021 City Council Meeting, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 21 to amend the City Code as described in this summary publication as follows:
A municipal code text amendment to amend Columbus City Code Chapter 13: City Building Code to make housekeeping changes and update references to current Minnesota statutes and administrative rules governing the Minnesota State Building Code.
This Ordinance was adopted by the Columbus City Council on this 14th day of April and shall become effective after its publication. 1. Tax Assessor Resignation

A letter of resignation was submitted on March 24, 2021, from Todd Smith, Columbus' contract Tax Assessor, due to health issues. His last day will be June 30, 2021. Mr. Smith will be attending the LBAE meeting via zoom and has completed this year's quartile of inspections assigned by the County. He suggested a couple of possible assessors from the area who may be interested in contracting with Columbus. Elizabeth will follow up on those leads.

2. Administrative Technician Position Updated to Admin/Zoning Permit Technician

The Administrative Technician Position approved by Council for posting at the February 24, 2021 meeting, was put on hold until the Building Official position was filled. This was because part of the responsibilities of this position (scheduling building inspections) is a service provided by the Consulting firm. With the hiring of the Building Official Firm, we have revised the position, added back the Recording Secretary for Planning Commission duties, and shifted some permitting work from the Associate Planner position to this position (see attached spreadsheet for more detail). This increased the position from a 20 hour/week Administrative Technician position to a full time (40 hour/week) Permit Technician Position.

The Permit Technician Job Description will be updated and re-scored to reflect change in duties. It is anticipated that the salary range will remain as approved at the last Council Meeting, but if that is not the case, it will be brought back to Council for approval. The plan for funding the additional hours is detailed in the attached spreadsheet. The draft posting is also attached.
